A message from Lauri

2017 was a year of change and forward movement for Lake Logan, and it's all about partnerships.

I began discussions with Bishop José and the Board about Lake Logan in late spring and then met the amazing Trailblazers and Ambassadors at their annual retreat. Despite Lake Logan's financial struggles since its purchase by the Diocese in 2000, the passion of those who treasure this "thin place" is what drove me to accept the call to serve as executive director. (Okay, that – and the view can't be beat.) The charge given to me: make Lake Logan the vibrant, thriving, sustainable ministry it was meant to be.

We have the raw natural resources – the pristine lake, the majestic mountains, the incredible wildlife. We have the quaint historical buildings, the modern yet comfortable dining hall, the delicious food, the staff eager to serve. And most importantly, we have the people who care so deeply for this place of retreat – people who give time, talent, and treasure so that Lake Logan is the embodiment of God's kingdom here on Earth.

It became clear to me within my first month or so after I began in June, that what Lake Logan needs is to be more visible, more accessible, more welcoming. If we are to live out our mission of "welcoming all generations to experience restoration and reconciliation with God, one another, and all creation," we must throw open the gates and sing it from the mountaintops. The Episcopal Church welcomes all! Lake Logan welcomes all!

The question became, "How do we welcome all and maintain the retreat atmosphere that makes this thin place so very special?" I believe the answer starts with partnerships. The drive to develop partnerships started before my arrival with the inaugural Cold Mountain Music Festival. Now, much of my time as director is spent in the community – here in Haywood County and in the Diocese – getting to know people and organizations and discerning how we can serve one another.

We've developed brand new relationships with the Haywood County Chamber of Commerce, Leapfrog Tours, Haywood County TDA, Sarge's Animal Rescue Foundation, Rotary, Leadership Haywood County, local small businesses, and others. There are more to come.

We are strengthening our partnerships with the Diocese, Episcopal Church Women, Valle Crucis, Church of the Advocate, Cullowhee Mountain Arts, Evergreen (formerly Champion Paper), Curtis Wright Outfitters, and other churches and groups which we have hosted.

We are living into our new model as Lake Logan Conference Center and Camp Henry Inc. Kathryn and I are partners in ministry. We are the grateful stewards of this place and these ministries. What an honor!

We have opened our doors to the community in the form of day passes and season memberships, allowing residents and visitors to enjoy the property in a way that safeguards the experience of guest groups.

As the leader of the Lake Logan staff, I have worked to involve our management team in decision-making and to educate all staff on the mission of Lake Logan, allowing them the creativity to express that mission.

We have changed some of our policies and practices which enables us to be better stewards and are making considerable progress in making improvements to buildings and grounds. We developed a forestry management plan and increased recycling efforts. We have a new housekeeping team who are amazing in their commitment to keep the houses clean and comfortable. We have painted numerous buildings, re-floored Main Lodge Meeting Room, restored the floor and replaced the HVAC in Celebration Hall, re-roofed Celebration Hall and Hemlock, paved the entry driveway, and built the brick garden.

Thank you to all our Lake Logan friends and family – guests, campers, volunteers, donors, staff, and community. It is in partnership with YOU that Lake Logan will move forward in our mission to welcome all.

A message from Kathryn

To define Camp Henry in a single word is almost impossible, but if forced, the word I would use for Camp Henry 2017 is AWESOME. Everything about it was awesome!

The staff, chaplains, and nurses gave their all to the kids. They kept campers safe, nurtured their spiritual and personal souls, and helped them see God in their neighbors and themselves.

The theme of 2017 was "Catching Fire and Sharing the Light." Week after week, the chaplains helped us see God's gifts and light burning brightly in ourselves and each other and determine how we can best serve each other and the world. On the last night of every session, we shared in the Eucharist. This was a particularly moving part of camp because it was a celebration of God's love and of the week we had together. Campers had a huge hand in putting it together, from acting out readings to helping with the sermons. It was beautiful. During the Eucharist for our 7th-9th grade session we had an offering. Campers didn't offer any money or material possessions; they offered themselves. One by one, every camper went up to the altar, placed their hand upon it, and offered their gifts to God. They then shared how they were going to use those gifts to make the world a better place. I have to tell you, at the end, the air was full of not just love, but also hope. Hope and belief that we can share the love of Christ with all.

Camp Henry enjoyed the company of 413 wonderful campers, and we had an amazing time, playing games until our legs gave out, dancing like no one was watching, singing like angels to God, laughing so hard our bellies ached, and loving so much it brought us to tears. Although we did see a drop in numbers for our younger sessions (an 8% decrease overall), the popularity of our middle school sessions remains high. We also had a strong representation for the high school sessions. LAMP (Leadership, Adventure, Mission, and Program) participants grew in their strengths as young leaders working with the kids and continued to give back to the community, assisting with outreach programs at Grace Church in the Mountains and Asheville Buncombe Community Christian Ministry. Our first ever Family Camp saw 17 participants, and five out of six sessions of CHOS (Camp Henry Outdoor School) were full or over capacity, prompting us to offer additional sessions in 2018. Overall, the trend we have experienced over the past couple of years in regards to gender breakdown remains the same. The younger age groups have consistently seen an equal balance, and with every increase in age group, there are more females than males.

With our first full year as the new Lake Logan Conference Center and Camp Henry, Inc. coming to a close, we are pleased with the success of the new organizational structure. With lots of willing and eager Board members to help the Conference Center and Camp Henry grow, we are seeing the fruits of their labor. After only one summer with Lauri SoJourney as the Executive Director of Lake Logan Conference Center, we can't help but sing her praises. To be honest, we felt that way after only one day with her and look forward to seeing what the future holds. Additionally, a lot of the property has seen great improvements, including new paint, roofs, and floors in many of our well-loved buildings and structures. Thank you to the volunteers and individuals who have given gifts and worked tirelessly to make these improvements possible.

When I think of the future of Camp Henry, I can't help but smile with anticipation. We look forward to pushing ourselves to be better with every passing year, focusing on our strengths and adapting to meet the changing needs of families, young people, churches, and the community, by adjusting and adding programs and services.

Indeed, Camp Henry 2017 was awesome (even the weather was near perfect!). We can't wait to see what adventures and excitement 2018 holds. Thank you to everyone who had a hand in making this summer amazing! Thank you to the campers, families, staff, chaplains, nurses/doctors, Lake Logan staff, Board, friends, and supporters! Thank You, God, for Your continued blessings! Thank you!

CAMP Henry 2017



Over half of the campers came on scholarship because we believe that no child should miss the camp experience!



45 churches were represented at Camp Henry. Twelve Episcopal clergy served as chaplains. We celebrated the Eucharist 15 times.



413 campers had life-changing experiences at Camp Henry in 2017. That's 2431 camper days! 21 campers were adults, and 146 were from outside the Episcopal Church.

Camp Henry Outdoor School (CHOS) made at least 21 mountaintop climbs, and campers learned a wide range of outdoor skills while building confidence in God, each other, and themselves.



The season saw 14 campfires and heard the "Goodnight Song" 41 times.



We also experienced four Zombie Apocalypses.

5. Create a more sustainable financial future for Camp Henry and its ministry by augmenting the revenue by \$50,000 through the addition of programs, camper tuitions, grant achievements, and new and also improved fund-raising efforts.

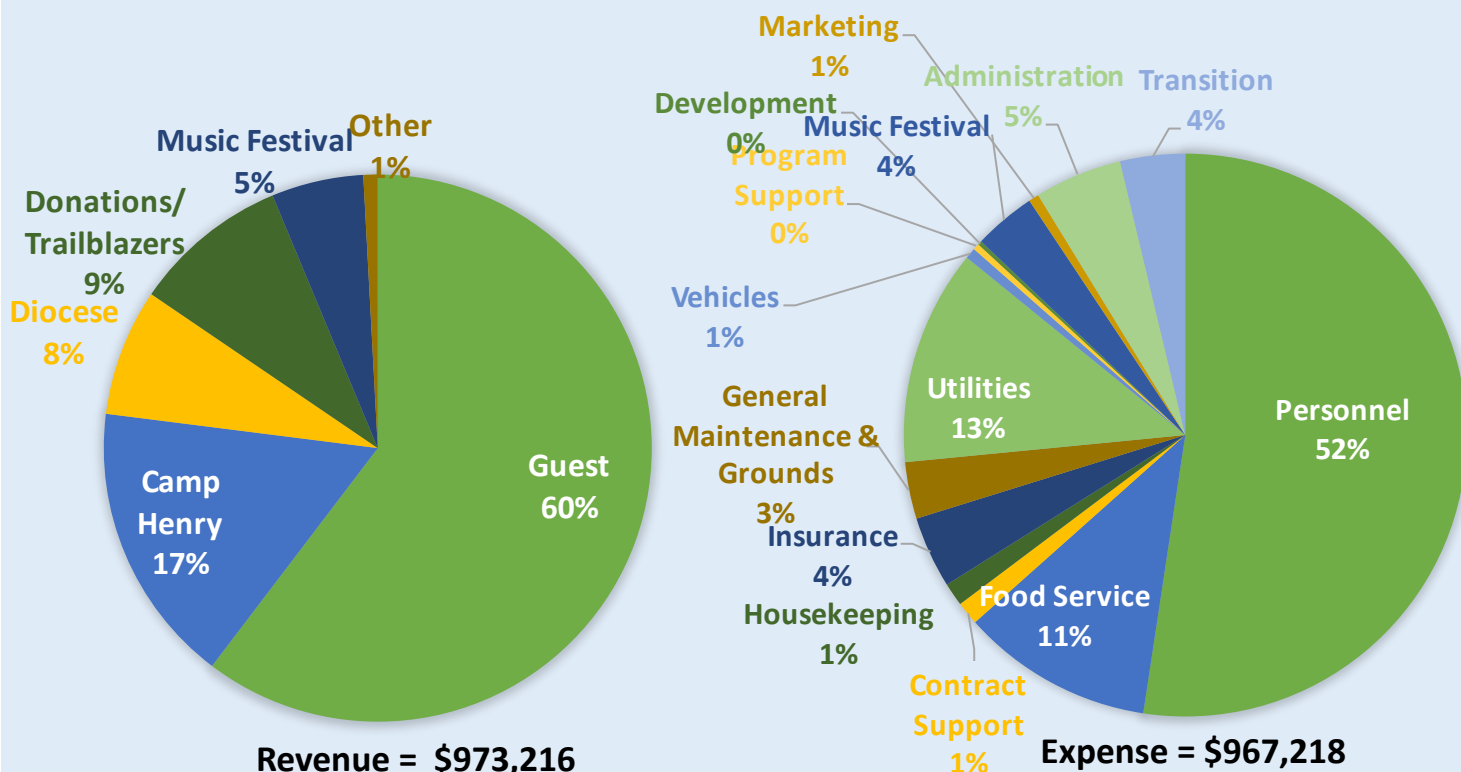

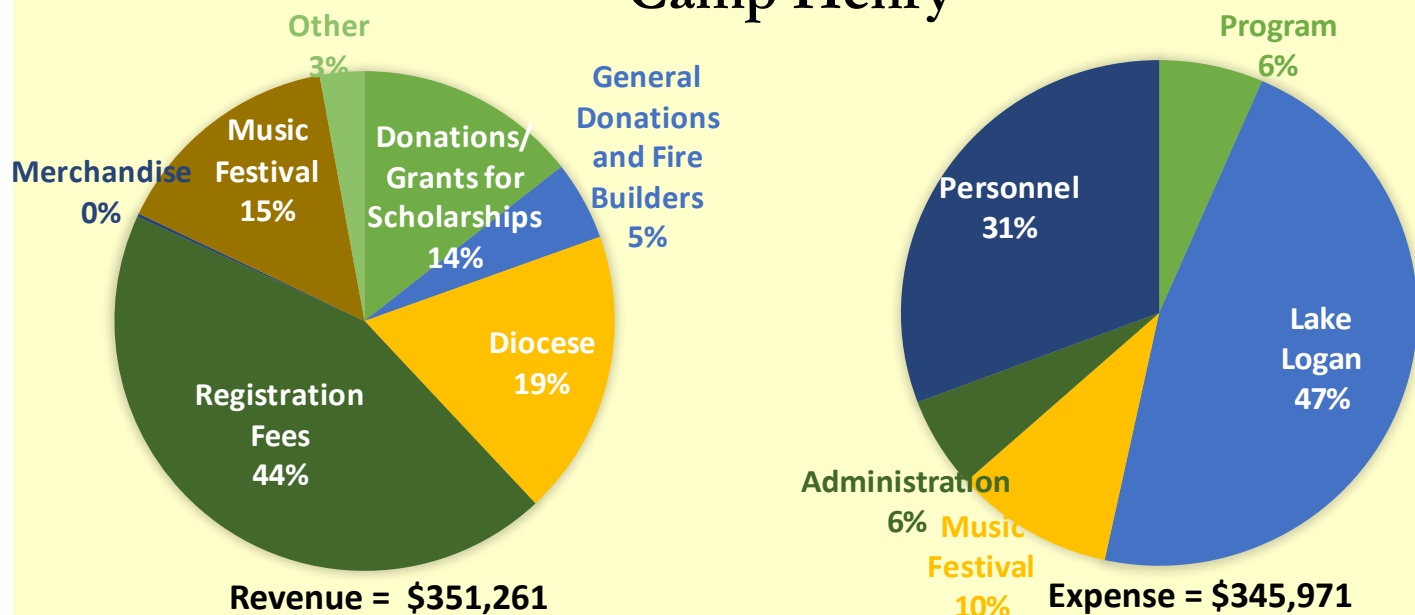

In Memoriam...

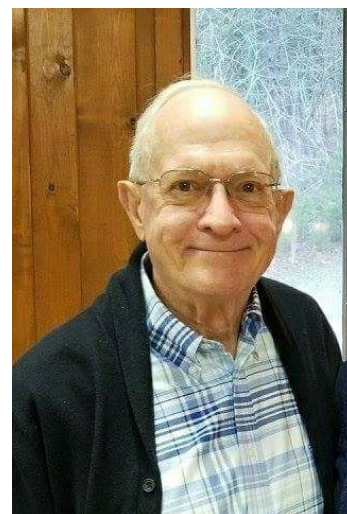
